

In Hebrew the word "HEART" can often be substituted for SOUL, meaning the total inner being of man. ** Faith is reflected in hope and love. Without faith there cannot be true hope or love. *** LOVE. Not the Greek word 'phileo' which expresses friendly affection, but 'agapeo', the comittment of devotion that is directed by the will and can be comanded as a duty.



WHO IS MAN?


God created a 3 part man with a 3 part soul.

1. BODY.

Man's perfect body at creation became subject to sickness, pain and death at the fall of man. The body is merely a container for the two most important parts of our being, our spirit and soul.

2. SPIRIT.

At the fall of man, God withdrew his Spirit but left man with a conscience so that man could still exercise his freewill - to choose between God and satan. Without a conscience there would only be one choice, sin. By removing his Spirit, God created a vacuum at the very core of our lives. A vacuum will draw air towards itself. Satan inhabits the atmosphere, [Ephesians 2:2] therefore the natural tendency in man is to draw satan's influence in to himself, to fill the vacuum left by the departure of God's Spirit.




NB. Bible references for this section are given on the chart What is Man

At conversion God gives us back his Holy Spirit to fill the vacuum. Therefore our sin level reduces as there is no longer a vacuum to attract it. Sin does not disappear however [Romans 7: 20 'I do what I do not want to do'] as satan is still bombarding us with sin from outside our body and sin is still entrenched in our soul. The only way we can rid ourselves of sin is to RELEASE the Spirit within us to work on our soul.

NOTE: A demon is a spirit being who may invade the body and/or soul. They are spiritual beings

THE BATTLE OF THE SPIRITS



which seek to possess and oppress man by inhabiting him. Even after a person becomes a christian and has the Holy Spirit residing within, a demon is still able to inhabit a part of that persons soul or body and influence their life. However it is very important to note that most sin in our lives is caused by the conscious decisions of our soul, not by demons. The battle of the spirits is illustrated diagramatically to the left of the page.

NOTE: To effectively penetrate our will, the Spirit must move through BOTH our mind and emotions. Full submission of our will to Christ requires us to open all areas of our life and being to His control.



3. SOUL.

God <u>wants our soul</u>, not our spirit, as the spirit belongs to him anyway - he gave Him to us! To be effective, the Spirit of the Lord must be released into all three parts of our soul.

- **a. MIND.** Through study of God's Word [the Bible] and prayer, saturating our minds in The Word [God]. This is reflected in the Reformation / Evangelical Church.
- **b. EMOTIONS**. Through praise and worship, joyfulness, application of the Gifts of the Spirit. This is reflected in the Pentecostal / Charismatic Church.
- c. WILL. The will forms the barrier between the total soul and sin. It is only by releasing the Holy Spirit into our will that we can resist sin effectively and move on to maturity [perfection] in Christ. This will be reflected in the final Mature Church yet to evolve. It is starting to be expressed today in concepts such as 'Holiness' and 'The Lordship of Christ'.

Both man and the church are developing from a MIND ORIENTATION (Reformation Church) adding an EMOTIONS ORIENTATION (Pentecostal/Charismatic Church) towards a SUBMISSION of WILL ORIENTATION (Mature Church) at the end of the age.

THE SOUL THE ESSENCE OF MAN

The soul is that part of our being that reveals us as an individual. The world often tries to identify us by our physical form but in reality, it is our soul, (our personality, nature or character) that is the essence of our being, the part of us which God wants and wants in its entirety.

Since man lost the vital balancing influence of God's Spirit on his soul at the time of the fall, he has been and still is, subject to a continuing, one-sided barrage of influence from satan (as demonstrated in the previous illustration). He is born sinful (as a result of Adam's fall) and naturally lives a sinful life. The balance in his life can only be re-established by rebuilding his relationship with God. God has stipulated that the only way acceptable to Him of mending this relationship is through man establishing a personal relationship with His Son, Jesus Christ.

Man's 3 part soul is a reflection of his 3 part body, made in the likeness of a 3 part God and

consists of:

WHICH PART OF THE SOUL IS THE MOST IMPORTANT TO GOD?

1 Corinthians 13:13 'And now these three remain: faith, hope and love.

But the greatest of these is love.'

The greatest problem of contemporary Christians and the Church as a whole is:

- a. That they believe the facts about Jesus in their mind and
- b. They have faith in Jesus in their hearts as expressed through their emotions but
- They are **not** prepared to commit their will, their total being, to the **love of God** and **the love of their fellow man**. (Good works)



Salvation is obtained through God's grace alone.

However to be proven to be real,

true salvation must also be reflected in love,
in committment, both to God and to our fellow
man. Ephesians 2: 8-10.

Jesus has warned man about the consequences of the shallow, low commitment style of faith and salvation so often found in the christian church today.

Don't believe me - look at what it says in the Bible!

The Wide and Narrow Gate. ([Matthew 7:13-14) 'Enter through the narrow gate. For wide is the gate and broad is the road that leads to destruction, and many enter through it. But small is the gate and narrow the road that leads to life, and only a few find it.'

The Narrow Door .(Type of Christians - ate and drank with you , i.e. communion)
(Luke 13: 22-29) vs 26-27 ' Then you will say, "We ate and drank with you, and you taught in our streets." but he will reply "I don't know you, or where you are from. Away from me all you evildoers." '

The Sheep and the Goats (showing love to God's people)

Matthew 25:31-46. Vs 45-46 'I tell you the truth, whatever you did not do for the least of one of these, you did not do for me. Then they will go away to eternal punishment, but the righteous to eternal life.'

Religious Form. (Matthew 6:1-18) Vs 5 'And when you pray, do not be like the hypocrites, for they love to pray standing in the synagogues and on the street corners to be seen by men. I tell you the truth, they have received their reward in full.'

One Master. (Matthew 6:19-24) Vs 24 'No-one can serve two masters. Either he will hate the one and love the other, or he will be devoted to one and despise the other. You cannot serve both God and money.'

Matthew 7:21

Have you entered the Door of Salvation by being a 'doer' or are you just a thinking and feeling Christian? (You think you feel you might do it some day!!)
Only by doing God's will for you, will you enter the Kingdom of God.

Matthew 7: 21 'Not everyone who says to Me "Lord, Lord" will enter the Kingdom of Heaven, but only he who does the will of My Father, who is in Heaven'

How Is Man To Live?

Old Testament . (Covenant)

External Laws (written on stone) given by God to Moses and known as the Ten Commandments. (Exodus 20: 1-17)


Man's Relationship With God.

- 10. You shall not desire other's possessions.


These are the Laws of Outward Religion.

(NEW COVENANT , Testament)



Salvation is a free gift from God, which is to be reflected in the committment of our life to Him. There is no easy salvation. (Hebrews 10: 36)

This is reflected in:

The Commandments of Jesus.

The Greatest Commandment.

'The most important one ,'answered Jesus, 'is this. Hear, Israel, the Lord our God, the Lord is one. Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul (life or will) and with all your mind and with all your strength. The second is this: Love your neighbour as yourself! There is no greater commandment that these." (Mark 12: 30-31, Matthew 22: 37-39, Luke 10: 27)

The Golden Rule

A Guideline For Daily Decisions

The so-called Golden Rule is found in a negative form in many other religions, e.g. Hinduism, Buddhism, and Confucianism, and in various ethical teachings, e.g. Greek and Roman. Jesus however stated it in a positive form in Matthew 7:12' So in everything, do to others what you would have them do unto you, for this sums up the Law and the Prophets.1


Look at everything in the mirror of our mind

before we do it. If we don't like what we see,

don't do it!

Old Covenant (Testament)

- 1 Lived according to an External Law.
- 2. Sinful nature meant man kept on sinning.
- 3. Individual sins forgiven through the sacrifice of blood - a continuing process.



Obeyed the law because they were TOLD to.

New Covenant (Testament)

- We can now live (through faith in Jesus) by an Internal Law written on our hearts.
- 2. Our sinful nature means we still keep sinning (but there is an answer).
- 3. All our Sin is forgiven through the once only sacrifice of Jesus on the Cross.

Obey the law because we WANT to.








<u>The Parables of Jesus</u> <u>His Secret Messages To Us His Followers</u>

Jesus often spoke in parables to reveal God's truths to those then and now who were and are

'spiritually aware'. The parables (story with a hidden meaning) mean

little or nothing to the non-believer but for the Christian are magnificent jewels of spiritual truth. Being directed specifically at believers, they reveal God's concerns for His followers.

It is therefore both interesting and important to analyse the general themes of the parables to get an over-all picture of the teachings Jesus was endeavouring to get across to those who follow Him. By this method we may get a better understanding of God's requirements of us as we walk



with Him, the results of not walking in His path, and the main problems we are likely to encounter along the way.



The 3 Dominant Themes of the Parables

1. Riches / Love of Money.

The biggest threat to an individual's ability to live for God is the love of wealth and money (whether you already have it and are trying to keep it, or you are striving to get it!) Jesus frequently stated the basic truth that it is far easier for the poor and weak to find the way of salvation than the rich and famous. We cannot serve 2 masters, God and money.

Where do you stand?

2. Fruit / Christian Values.

The only sign of a genuinely saved believer is the production of 'good fruit' in their life. Salvation MUST be reflected in action!

Where do you stand?

3. Judgment for No Fruit.

The picture is very clear. If the tree does not produce righteous fruit there has been no salvation. Unless you live the life you believe in you are not saved and will not have received God's gift of eternal life.

Where do you stand?

'Easy Believer' Christianity with one foot in the world and the other in the Church results in Eternal Damnation.. Eternal Life begins at Salvation (1 John 5:11) and God requires us to live that life from the day we are saved. Half measures and compromises are not acceptable to God.

<u>25 Specific Commandments of Jesus</u>

The four Gospels contain the specific commandments of Jesus to us.

Not clearly and simply listed, as are the outward laws of the Ten Commandments, they are found among the teachings of Jesus for those who have a heart to seek them.

('He who seeks finds' Luke 11: 10)

The 25 commandments relate to:


- <u>Salvation</u> (8),

THE MOST PERPLEXING QUESTION OF ALL!

HOW DO I KEEP JESUS'S COMMANDMENTS?

We have made our decision for Jesus. We really want to live by His commandments but we so often fail. We all face this difficulty. It is the ultimate challenge of living the Christian life. The problem is not new. It was even faced by the Apostle Paul (Romans 7:7-25).


v15 'I do not understand what I do. For what I want to do I do not do, but what I hate I do'

v20 'Now if I do what I do not want to do, it is no longer I who do it, but it is sin that is living in me that does it.'

At salvation our SINS (sinful acts) are forgiven but our SIN (sinful nature) remains. Overcoming our sinful nature is the ultimate challenge of living the Christian life.

The Sin Question


A great coincidence! The middle letters of two of the words that best describe our human condition!



The answer to the sin question revolves around removing the 'I' from our lives. Easily said, hard to do!

This is illustrated in the Bible by comparison to fruiting trees.

THE EFFECT OF SALVATION






Has this been your experience? As the initial fire and enthusiasm of salvation has died down, have you reverted back to many of your old ways, as a grafted tree eventually reverts back to its original rootstock?

The Answer

Galations 2:20 'I have been crucified with Christ, and I no longer live but CHRIST LIVES IN ME.'



Romans 12:1-2

Therefore I urge you brothers, in view of God's mercy, to offer your bodies as living sacrifices, holy and pleasing to God - This is your spiritual act of worship. Do not conform any longer to the pattern of this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your mind. Then you will be able to test and approve what God's will is - his good, pleasing and perfect will.'

Many 'Christians' are prepared to accept the free gift of salvation for their soul, but are not prepared to sacrifice themselves to Jesus in return for the sacrifice He made for them. This is necessary to determine God's will for us. (Romans 12:1-2)Obeying God's will is in turn necessary for us to get to heaven. (Matthew 7:21)

There is no such thing as 'EASY CHRISTIANITY' (salvation without sacricfice.)
True salvation <u>MUST</u> be reflected in submission of self to Christ's will.



THE ACTS OF THE DISCIPLES A PUZZLE

Before Jesus Died

In spite of having what we would see to be the incredible advantage of living with and being taught by Jesus, the disciples were a pretty motley lot, showing a remarkable lack of understanding about the teachings of Jesus (e.g. Luke 18:34).

On occasions they displayed a considerable lack of faith e.g.'Doubting' Thomas, (John 20:24-31) and endurance (falling asleep in the Garden of Gethsemane, Matthew 26;36-46). Peter even ultimately denied knowledge of the Lord 3 times. (Matthew 26:69-75).

Had they been alive today exhibiting this behaviour, they certainly wouldn't have been considered 'exceptional Christians'!

After Jesus Died

The disciples, now apostles (i.e. church planters), underwent an amazing transformation, when together with the Apostle Paul (not one of the original 12) and some other followers of Jesus, they changed the face of human history for all time, while undergoing and withstanding persecution, prison, and for many, ultimately martyrdom. Peter for example, denied Jesus 3 times before the crucifixion but finally sacrificed his life for his beloved Saviour around 65 A.D., during the reign of the Roman Emperor Nero.

A group of very ordinary men had suddenly become a dedicated army of inspirational and highly effective Christian workers, prepared even to die for their Lord. Had they been alive today they would have been considered to be truly outstanding Christians, willing and able to change the face of the world.

What Made The Difference?

GOD'S PROVISION FOR HIS OWN THE HOLY SPIRIT.

Satan's No. 1 Enemy.

The Holy Spirit is Satan's No.1 enemy. Satan realises only too well the supreme power of the Holy Spirit in the battle between God and himself, between good and evil, between heaven and earth; between life and death.

Satan, defeated at the cross, as promised by God at the fall of man (Genesis 3:15 'He (Jesus) will crush your head...) is living out his inevitable death throes (Romans 16: 20 'The God of peace will soon crush Satan under your feet') to be fulfilled upon Christ's return (Revelation 20: 2 'He seized the dragon, that ancient serpent who is the devil, or Satan, and bound him for a thousand years') ...See later study for more details.



Because of this understanding and hatred, Satan is 'hellbent' on nullifying the influence of the Holy Spirit by having Christians argue amongst themselves concerning the realm of the Holy Spirit in Christians lives, and in the Church, something he could not accomplish in any other way. And we fall for it! How sad it is and how God must be grieved by our sorry behaviour.

Let's set aside our preconceived notions and convictions, be tolerant of others with differing views, while searching God's Word, the Bible, for the marvellous truths God is waiting to reveal to us. Then let us pray and wait upon the Holy Spirit to reveal himself to each one of us.

Adam and the Holy Spirit.

It was God's intention from the creation, when He 'breathed life' (Genesis 2:7) into Adam, that man should walk with Him 'in the garden in the cool of the day'

(Genesis 3: 8) Adam being sinless was filled with the Holy Spirit to the measure we will only be able to experience when we also become sinless. When Adam sinned he was banished from the garden (Genesis 3: 23) and he lost the fellowship with God he had previously enjoyed. Mankind therefore, through their decision to exercise their right of choice and to sin, lost the third part of their makeup, their spirit, the Holy Spirit that had lived inside Adam (remember, man's makeup of body, soul and spirit). Why? Because God is not prepared to live

makeup of body, soul and spirit). Why? Because God is not prepared to live with sin.

It was not until Jesus came to free man from sin through belief in Him, that God, in the form of the Holy Spirit, was prepared to live inside of man once again.

The Holy Spirit in a Nutshell.

- 1. When Adam (mankind) sinned we lost communion with God.
- 2. God will not live with sin.
- Only when we have our sins forgiven through belief in Jesus will God once again dwell inside us in the form of His Holy Spirit.

The Unveiling of the Holy Spirit.

The Bible progressively reveals the 3 part mystery of the Godhead as shown in the timeline below.

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This progressive revealing of the 3 aspects of God's nature is one of the wonders of the Bible, yet is misunderstood by many Christians today, who see the Old Testament as revealing God the Father, the New as revealing Jesus with the Holy Spirit just tacked on somewhere at the end. An important part of Jesus' ministry was to re-introduce the Holy Spirit (lost when Adam and Eve sinned) to mankind to be available to dwell within born again believers until Jesus returns in victory!

For our purpose we can look at this re-introduction as being in 3 stages (the number of God). While these 3 events can be interpreted in different ways, they do follow a logical pattern in the preparation of God's people for the culmination of the Holy Spirit's return to mankind at Pentecost.

1.Before His Death - The Promise of Jesus,

John 14: 16-17a 'And I will ask the Father and He will give you another counsellor to be with you forever - the Spirit of Truth.' v26 'But the Counsellor, the Holy Spirit, whom the Father will send in My Name, will teach you all things and will remind you of everything I have said to you.' Words of comfort given to the disciples in the upper room on the night in which Jesus was betrayed. One imagines the disciples having difficulty understanding what Jesus meant, as indeed people still do today.

2. After His Resurrection - The First Taste.

John 20: 22 'And with that He breathed on them and said, 'Receive the Holy Spirit' '.

A symbolic limited gift of the Holy Spirit to:-

a. Signify the Holy Spirit was now to be available to mankind again as it was to Adam, through Jesus' defeat of Satan (sin) on the cross. (God breathed life into Adam, Jesus breathed on the disciples.)

b. Give the disciples encouragement and support to wait for the full outpouring of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost.

3. After His Ascension - The Return of the Holy Spirit to Man

Acts 2: 3-4 'They saw what seemed to be tongues of fire that separated and came to rest on each of them. All of them were filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other tongues as the Spirit enabled them.'

The day of Pentecost marked the beginning of the Spirit phase of God's work amongst his people on the earth.

- Q. What made the disciples changed men?
- A. The power of the Holy Spirit transformed the disciples from very ordinary men into apostles who changed the course of Human history.
- Q. How can we live the life demanded of us by Jesus?
- A. Only by allowing the Holy Spirit to take over our life.

SALVATION AND THE HOLY SPIRIT

EASY CHRISTIANITY.

"Easy Christianity", promoted in many churches today, focuses on "Salvation", the making of a descion for Christ, as being the only necessary requirement for being a Christian and receiving eternal life. Subsequent behaviour is not considered to be very important. Taken to the extreme, provided you are "Born Again" you can just about do what you like and still receive eternal life. Easy Christianity is based on receiving God's free gift of Salvation without requiring any sacrifice from the receiver. It promotes the "fairy godmother" principle of God giving free gifts without making any demands upon the recipient in return.

EASY CHRISTIANITY IS BASED ON RECEIVING.

Biblical Christianity

Biblical (or hard) Christianity begins with salvation but culminates in our submission to God's will, freely given as our personal sacrifice to our Almighty Saviour for His great goodness and mercy to

True salvation is reflected in a changed life.

This cannot come about from our own human resources but only through letting the Holy Spirit permeate and take over our life.

God gives us the means of changing our life - the power of the Holy Spirit living within us.

But He requires us to utilize this power to transform our own lives into the image of Jesus!


Biblical Christianity is Based on Giving.

BEING FILLED WITH THE HOLY SPIRIT.

Avoiding theological issues altogether, practical experience tells me that the best way of describing the empowering of the Holy Spirit is -

Our Release of the Power of the Holy Spirit Into Our Soul [Mind, Emotions and Will]

This can happen at conversion, at a later stage in our Christian walk, or at different times during our life. This experience can perhaps be most clearly explained in diagramatic form.




1 Thessalonians 5: 23-24 'May your whole spirit, soul and body be kept blameless at the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ. The one who calls you is faithful and he will do it.'

It is not enough to receive the Holy Spirit into our life.

The Lord requires that we allow His Spirit
to permeate our soul and our body
so that we might achieve perfection in Christ.

The Glow of the Holy Spirit

Do you know that special person who seems to glow with the presence of the Holy Spirit? They have let the Spirit so permeate their soul [life] that His glory can then be reflected through their body!



Why the Holy Spirit?

The Bible gives us 4 reasons why God in His Almighty wisdom, grace and love chose to dwell in us in the form of His Holy Spirit.

1. As the Sign of Salvation.

Ephesians 1: 13b 'Having believed, you were worked in Him with a seal, the promised Holy Spirit.'

-the presence of the Holy Spirit in our life distinguishes us as Christians from the non-Christian.

2. As the Promise of Future Glory.

Ephesians 1:14 'who is a deposit guaranteeing our inheritance until the redemption of those who are God's possession - to the praise of His glory.'

- the presence of the Holy Spirit in our life, tremendous as it is, is only a small foretaste of what is to come in heavenly glory!

3. As the Sign of Having Received Eternal Life Now!

John 3: 36a 'Whoever believes in the Son HAS eternal life.'

1 John 5: 13b 'so that you may KNOW that you have eternal life'

- the promise that our soul lives with Him NOW and FOREVER.

4. To Help Us Develop the Character of God.

John 14: 26a 'But the Counsellor, the Holy Spirit, whom the Father will send in My Name will teach you all things'.

John 15: 16a 'You did not choose me but I chose you and appointed you, to go and bear fruit - fruit that will last.'

- being a part of God, we are expected to develop His character in our lives.

2. A REAL SPIRIT WHO REALLY DOES COMMUNICATE WITH US.

The Holy Spirit's communication with us is dependant on our willingness to be open to Him. Many Christians erect a barrier between themselves and the Holy Spirit - a barrier of FEAR. Why fear? Because deep down most of us don't want to be challenged, don't want to change the way we live HOLY our lives. We are afraid of what we might hear, what **SPIRIT** might be requested (not commanded) of us

if we opened ourselves up fully to His leading. Most of us don't like stepping into the unknown, to let another guide our lives. This is particularly so for men, who by na-

ture, generally seek a dominant position in their relationships with others. A woman's natural subservience (Genesis 3:16)

gives her a giant head start in forming this relationship, perhaps explaining why women are generally considered to be the more spiritual and why there are more women than men in the church. In general a woman is more open to placing her faith and trust in the Holy Spirit.

3. WAYS THE HOLY SPIRIT COMMUNICATES WITH ME.

Our personal relationship with the Holy Spirit is an individual thing. Just as we all communicate differently within marriage, so we all have differing relationships with the Holy Spirit. In my natural nature, I am not an empathetic person [ask my wife], nor one who is willing to be subservient to authority or respecting of it! To be open to the Holy Spirit has therefore meant big changes in my life, has been, and continues to be, a real step of faith for me. I am sharing some of the ways He communicates with me, not because they will all necessarily apply to you, but as an indication of some of the methods the Holy Spirit uses to lead those who are open to His guidance.

Are you prepared to take down the 'barrier of fear' that protects your life?



1. Dreams, Visions

I do not remember dreams! Yet one night I was given 4 dreams, relating to different areas of my life, that I will remember until the day I die. That's how clear they were! Something special. Not day dreams, not wishful thinking but specific encouragement (1, given first) and specific guidance (3) on areas of my life that required dealing with at the time.

But most of the time He talks to me through the Bible.

2. Word of Knowledge.

A word for someone that you just know is not of your imagination but is of God for them. These words are factual and of encouragement only, NOT critical or condemnatory.

But most of the time He talks to me through the Bible.

3. Direct Inspiration.

Words and tune of the song 'Lord Be With Me' given to me [not a musical person] at the conclusion of a phone call one morning as I was getting the kids ready to go to school. The words were written down in 10 minutes, the tune placed in my head for later penning by a friend who could convert it into a written musical form.

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4. Direct Instruction,

By the audible voice of the Holy Spirit, of the outline of a message I was to present to a church. It was given at a communion service and filled out during the hour following the service. This message was confirmed in several ways before it was given.

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5 Through Another Person.

Near the conclusion of my preparation for this message I was given a verse by another person, that had been given to her to give to me. She didn't know what I was saying or why she was to give it to me. It completed the message perfectly!

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6 Through Opening Doors.

The pastor involved confirmed the message and allowed his pulpit to be used for its presentation. But most of the time He talks to me through the Bible.

7. Placing Matters On My Mind.

This course was gradually put on my mind over a period of time. It is extremely important however to be able to discern what is of the Spirit and what is of ourself. We are experts at deluding ourselves into thinking that what we would like for ourselves is what

God wants for us! We are great at telling God what we would like to do for Him, rather than waiting on Him to tell us what He wants to do with us! Usually the two things are quite different! But most of the time He talks to me through the Bible.



8. Waiting on the Lord.

The Lord told me he wanted me to do this ministry but I didn't have a clue where to start! I got desperate enough for inspiration just to place it in His hands and then sit and wait, in silence, for the Holy Spirit to instruct me. The story of the 2 Marathon Runners resulted. The story came on the first day, the interpretation the next.

But most of the time He talks to me through the Bible.

9. Prophecy On My Life.

Difficult for me to subject myself to! Scared of what might be said! Had to put myself right with others before doing it! Was it worth it? Definitely yes! Prophecy however has to be lived out, the promises will not be fulfilled without effort on our behalf and with the continuing guidance of the Holy Spirit. The prophecy was given under the controlled conditions of a presbytery by two prophets unknown to me, each giving a similar message (agreement is necessary for the prophecy to be valid) and later confirmed elsewhere. Genuine prophecies are always encouraging, very often not spectacular, but always helpful and never critical.

But most of the time He talks to me through the Bible.

10. The Holy Spirit Quickening A Prophecy To Me.

A prophecy was given by a pastor at a service relating to one person present, that the Spirit told me was for me.

But most of the time He talks to me through the Bible.

11. My Conscience. (Now Spirit)

Telling me what I should do in a situation, when that old human nature tries to tell me to do something else!

But most of the time He talks to me through the Bible.

The way to develop a relationship with the Holy Spirit is through reading the Bible. He uses the Word to speak to us. If you earnestly seek Him He will find you!

4. Living With the Holy Spirit.

It is very important to understand 5 things if we wish to build a close and meaningful relationship with the Holy Spirit.

1. The Holy Spirit is a 'Gentle'-man.

He speaks in a quiet voice. He is an encourager. We need peace and quiet to hear Him. We need to develop the 'unfading beauty of a gentle and quiet spirit, which is of great worth in God's sight'. (1Peter 3: 4b)

2. We Don't HaveTo Do What the Spirit Says.

Like a true gentleman, the Holy Spirit suggests but He doesn't compel us to act. We retain the freewill to do what the Lord asks of us or to refuse to do it, (Genesis 2 : 16-17) but at our future peril!

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- Salvation is God's free gift which is to be reflected in faith and submission to receive eternal life.
- Spiritual gifts are God's power in us which must be reflected in obedience to God's will to retain eternal life.
 (Matthew 7: 21-23)

What Are The Gifts Of The Spirit

This subject is both vast and controversial. We can only briefly touch on these in this study.

The Gifts outlined in 1 Corinthians 12:8-11 are detailed here. Reference also needs to be made to Romans 12 and Ephesians 4.

*1. Word (Message) of Wisdom

'For wisdom is more precious than rubies and nothing you desire can compare with her' (Proverbs 8: 11) 'Christ Jesus who has become for us wisdom from God '(1 Corinthians 1: 30). The God given [not human] ability through inspired thought or vision, of how to deal with a particular situation or problem. e.g. John 8: 7 'Casting the first stone:'

*2. Word (Message) of Knowledge.

A God given thought, impression, or audible voice of the Holy Spirit. 'and He (the Holy Spirit) will tell you what is yet to come.' (John 16: 13b)

3. Gift of Faith.

'Consequently, faith comes from learning the message and the message is heard through the Word of Christ' (Romans 10 : 17). The gift of faith is the God given ability to have absolute assurance that God will do what He promises.

4. Gift of Healing.

'they will place their hands on sick people and they will get well' (Mark 16: 18b)
Healing is the God given gift through absolute faith by the healer, and repentance by the sick person, for God to bring about a process of healing over a period of time at His will.

5. Gift of Miraculous Powers. (Miracles)

This is generally associated with instant healing (John 14:11-12) and is the power to do miracles, through faith, by the power of the Holy Spirit moving through one person to an other to give immediate healing.

*6. Gift of Prophecy.

'But everyone who prophesies speaks to men for their strengthening, encouragement and comfort '(1 Corinthians 14:3). This positive, encouraging prophecy is for the edification of the church. Everyone is encouraged to seek this gift (1 Corinthians 24:31). It consists of thought, visions or audible words put into the mind by the Holy Spirit for sharing with our brothers and sisters in Christ.

7. Distinguishing Between Spirits.

A person is enabled to distinguish between spirits through a thought, vision, impression or voice from the Holy Spirit, making us aware of the fact that a person, or ourselves, is under the influence of spiritual forces. 'In the Name of Jesus Christ I command you to come out of her! At that moment the spirit left her.' (Acts 16: 18b).



8. Gift of (Public) Tongues.

'Do not forbid speaking in tongues' (1 Corinthians 14:39b) A maximum of 2-3 messages per meeting (1 Corinthians 14:27-28) which must be interpreted or else not given. This is to be distinguished from the private use of tongues.

*9. Interpretation of Tongues.

'Unless he interprets so that the church may be edified' (1 Corinthians 14:5b) An interpretation (not translation) of a tongue message is given through the power of the Holy Spirit by thought, impression, voice or vision.

*All gifts involving a communication with God need to be:-

- a. made in the context of a meeting.
- b. checked out.
- c. subject to correction.

Unfortunately man's mind can wilfully or mistakenly get in the way of communication with the Holy Spirit and it is therefore very important that the speaker be open to correction by others with a similar gifting.

The Tongues Controversy

The area of speaking in tongues is a potent weapon that Satan uses in his battle to turn christian against christian and church against church, therefore reducing our effectiveness in the fight against him.

Experts argue with great vehemence that speaking in tongues either is, or is not, a necessary sign of a Spirit-filled christian. It is not my intention to enter these arguments from a theological viewpoint. My practical, personal experience and observation of others has taught me:-

 Speaking in tongues is <u>a</u> sign of the release of the Holy Spirit into your soul and is experienced by the majority of Spirit-filled believers.

2. The private speaking in tongues should be encouraged among believers as it adds an extra dimension to our spiritual life.

3. The true sign of a Spirit-filled believer however, is the production of the fruit of the Spirit in our life. (see next study).

4. To prevent satan from destroying the church, all christians need to exercise tolerance of others' points of view on this subject.

The Power of the Tongue

Revelation 12: 11 They overcame him (i.e. satan) by:

- 1. The blood of the Lamb (i.e. Jesus).
- 2. By the word of their testimony. (ie Holy Spirit)

As a rudder steers a ship so the tongue reflects our religion (James 3 : 4-5)

The tongue is the most dangerous organ in our body, getting us into more trouble than any other. It is impossible for us to control our tongue by our human nature. It is only through the power of the Holy Spirit that our tongue (giving the word of our testimony) can be harnessed to steer our ship (body) so that our words and our actions are in harmony, totally focused on our Lord. 'Dear children, let us not love with words or tongue but with actions and truth'(1John3:18)

INTERPRETATION OF THE STORY OF 'THE TWO MARATHON RUNNERS'
